

#### BRIEF HISTORY

Colonel Frederick Hambright was born in Germany in 1727 during the reign of Frederick William I, the ardent military ruler.

It may have been to escape from this land of militarism that Adam and Conrade Hambright left their native land, arriving in Philadelphia in October 1738 with their families, and settling at Lancaster, Pa., where the Hambrights have long been prominent citizens. It is believed that Conrade was the father of Frederick, then a lad about 11 years of age.

About 1755 Frederick Hambright migrated to Virginia, where he married Sara Hardin. Then, about 1760 he moved to North Carolina and settled near the South Fork of the Catawba river — and in the vicinity of Long Creek Presbyterian Church.

By his first marriage to Sara Hardin, Colonel Hambright had 12 children; by his second wife, Mary Dover, whom he married in 1781, there were 10 children, 22 in all, and 14 of the 22 reached maturity.

Frederick Hambright, one of the heroes at Kings Mountain October 7, 1780, was a member of Shiloh Presbyterian Church. He deeded the old Shiloh graveyard property to the church in 1789, the place of his burial in 1817. The Shiloh cemetery is still maintained, located 1 mile Southeast of Grover, N. C.

His Bible has been handed down through the family, and is now in the hands of an elder of Shiloh Church. His sabre is in the museum at Kings Mountain Military Park.

Colonel Hambright played his part nobly in helping to swing the war's tide in favor of independence. He lived the remainder of his life in sight of the field of battle — limping always from the wound received in line of duty. He left a fine record both as a Soldier and Citizen for which his descendents are justly proud.
