

Minutes of the 32nd annual reunion of
The Hambrights

Grover Rescue Squad Center
Grover, North Carolina
October 15, 1978

As the descendants of Colonel Hambright gathered around the food laden tables all bowed as God's blessing was asked by William H. Hambright.

Following exchanged greetings and enjoying the delicious food, the meeting was called to order by the President, Mrs. Odie Eaker.

Some had traveled a great distance. A large group traveled from Illinois - the Gordon Babcocks, the Graydon Perry's, the Leonard Shells. The greatest distance, of 785 miles, was traveled by Nedra Courtaway and Daisy Hopson from Beckett, Missouri.

The oldest member present - Miss Annie Hambright, who was born March 13, 1889.

The youngest present - Eric Hambright, the son of Alice and Keith was born April 12. They were outside April Michelle Putnam, 15 months of age, is again the youngest of the descendants present.

Senator Ollie Harris told us of a celebration planned in 1980 - 200 years since the decisive battle at Kings Mountain. Ollie asked each to make plans to attend. 22 people present were at the Battleground in 1930 at the celebration. He said he hoped to get a marker to Shiloh cemetery from the state if the Hambright organization would make the request. The motion was made and seconded to start procedures.

Mrs. William Hambright was asked to give a report on Shiloh Church for the next year. Sarah invited the group to come, especially during 1980. Shiloh Presbyterian church was the Colonda's church.
